

Andy Boersma

Regarded as one the best high school divers to ever come out of Michigan, Andy has the distinction of being Portage Central's only two-time High School National Champion. Having only started to dive in middle school, Andy emerged as one of the areas top divers during his freshman year. Through his hard work and dedication, Andy won the State Championship his junior year. After being named National Champion by the National Swim Coaches Association, Andy followed that up during his senior year, by setting 7 pool records, 3 varsity (one swimming relay), 1 conference, 2 G-K records, and quite possibly holds the unofficial national record for 11 dives. More importantly, Andy was a team player, who helped the Mustangs to their first conference championship in 13 years during his senior year. Andy not only dove, but earned all-conference honors by swimming the 50 free and the winning 200 free relay. At the college level, Andy took his diving to Indiana University where he was a two time All-American in both the 1 meter & 3 meter diving.
