One of Portage Central's great 1980s all-around female athletes, Robin excelled at basketball, volleyball, and softball, earning All-Conference in both basketball and volleyball. A natural sport leader, Robin captained the Mustangs her senior year, which helped lay the ground work for her outstanding college coaching career. Robin topped off her high school career by earning the rare double of both the Jean Smith and the B'nai B'rith scholar athlete awards. After earning All-State honors in volleyball, she took her volleyball to the collegiate level where she played for two years at Lake Michigan College, then two years at University of New Haven. It is there that Robin joined the professional ranks of coaching and became University New Haven's head coach in 1994 and has continue to lead them to numerous NCAA tournament appearances along with nine Elite Eight finishes at the national championship level.
