CLASS OF 1986

One of Portage Central's greatest track athletes. Wayland recorded one of the Mustang's greatest track days at the state level. In 1986, he scored 22 points on his own, finishing in the top eight in four different events. During his sophomore year, Wayland help lead the Mustangs to their first track champion conference championship in 32 years. Scoring 22 points on his own. At the time of his graduation, Wayland owned or tied four varsity records (tying Bernie Meyers long time hundred yard dash school record set in 1932). He has the distinction of being the only athlete to lead the men's track team in scoring all four years. In football, Wayland starred as a running back. After graduation, Wayland distinguished himself by serving in the Armed Forces for 21 years.

Greatest thrill: *being on the 1984 championship track team.*

- Scored 22 individual points in the 1986 State meet, including a 2nd place in the 200, two 3^{rds} in the 100 and 400, and one 7th in the long jump

- Leading Team Scorer – 1983, 84, 85, 86
