

Virtual Learning - Student Expectations

General Expectations

- Students are expected to login to the Google Meet link for each hour for attendance & instruction.
- Students are responsible for turning in and completing all assignments on time
- Remember that we are still in school if you are an online student. All regular NHS school expectations & handbook policies still apply.

Where should I sit?

- If possible, in a quiet, well-lit place so as not to disturb either the class lesson or your family. This way, you will be able to hear better, too.
- Where there is a reliable Internet connection and a stable place for your computer/device.

How should I use Google Meet features?

- Leave the video camera on during class time (Unless you have communicated with the teacher).
- Mute microphone until it's your turn to speak. The microphone picks up all sounds. It's good for when you have to answer a question, but not as great if your brother or sister is playing loudly.
- Make sure your video background is school appropriate.
- Teachers will tell you when and how to use the chat feature.
- Presenter view to see just the teacher or other presenter. Tiled view to see the whole class.
- Use the Closed Caption feature if you are having a hard time hearing the conversation.

Before Class:

- Dress in school appropriate outfits.
- Find the Meet invitation(s) for that day in your Google Classroom and use the link to join the lesson.

During Class:

- Remember you are "in class" so behave as if you are so that everyone can learn as best they can.
- Listen to the teachers' instructions.
- Don't walk around the room or even your home, don't jump on the bed, don't play with your pet on screen.
- Turn off notifications and sound on your phone.

Safety Reminders:

- Remember you are at school and all handbook expectations apply.

Stay Connected:

- The Google Meet link is not the only way to communicate with your teachers. Email or set up a phone call if you would like to work something out or if you have questions.
- If you are ever absent from a class, email the teacher right away to get what instruction/information you may have missed.
